Whanaungatanga	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It is about relationships, connections and feeling a sense of belonging. • Getting to know one another. • inclusiveness • connections • shared experiences • working together. 	<p>Multiplayer games that require players to work together</p> <p>Get games to reflect or remember information about each player</p> <p>Games that promote teamwork.</p>
Kotahitanga	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Oneness; Unity; Everyone doing the same thing at the same time. 	<p>Encourage cooperation in games where all players have to work together and support each other.</p>
Maramatanga	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Understanding. Knowledge. • You can see the relevance in learning something and how to apply it. 	<p>Ensure the rules for the games are provided, Develop hand outs, Provide opportunities for ākongā to participate at every level of the game</p> <p>i.e., Offline - refereeing, team leader, coaching.</p> <p>Online - Moderator; player; coach</p>
Tuakana / Teina	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Older/senior rangatahi looking after the younger/junior rangatahi. • Experienced helping those less experienced. 	<p>Assign older rangatahi responsibility of taking care of others less able in the group.</p> <p>Rangatahi who are further along in their learning helping those just starting out.</p>
Kaitiakitanga	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Guarding our taonga based on Māori world views. Includes conservation, replenishment and sustainability of the environment. It is about safeguarding the future. 	<p>Ensure the grounds / facilities are in the same condition or better as when they arrive. ie pick up rubbish, recycle where appropriate</p>

Veitokoni	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Mutual support (partnership) in good and bad times	2 player game where both players are needed for success
Veirogorogoci	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• ongoing communication with, sharing with, and listening to each other	In a 2 player game each player could get different information and they need to share for success
Veivakabekabei	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Praising - the importance of "valuing and nurturing" via positive reinforcement and generating unity	Giving rewards to players at different parts of the game to encourage them

NIUEAN

Value	Description and what it looks like	Ideas you could incorporate into your game design
Uho he matutakiaga	<ul style="list-style-type: none">The preciousness of connecting to one another	Ensure the game is collaborative not combative and is multi player.
Fakaveaga he mafola	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Adherence to or holding on to peace	Use slow movement and peaceful music to create a serene game
Fakafetuiaga	<ul style="list-style-type: none">The strength of bonds that are created and maintained between people because of their connection to one another and the intention to fill the space between each other with good conduct	Create and abide by Code of Conduct that encourage good inter personal behaviour. Kick people from the game that don't abide by the code of conduct
Fakalilifu	<ul style="list-style-type: none">honouring or glorifying another	Ability to give shout outs to other players in game
Leveki/puipuiaga	<ul style="list-style-type: none">care of, protecting and sheltering one another	Have a player in the game that is a healer and can restore other players 'health'

TOKELAU

Value	Description and what it looks like	Ideas you could incorporate into your game design
Te Kāiga Māopoopo	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Absolute unity and purpose to achieve wellbeing for the individual and collective through peace and respect.	A game that you grow food for and feed your community and have to make sure everyone is feed.
Māopoopo	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Requires individuals to actively participate and work in unison with members of the collective	A game with multiple players that must work together to do tasks to proceed
Fakahoa lelei	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Is the spirit of fairness involved in the equal distribution of communal resources by which everyone is apportioned their equitable share	A game where all resources and rewards you collect get distributed to your team fairly.

COOK ISLANDS MĀORI

Ngakau aro'a	<ul style="list-style-type: none">The willingness and conviction of the heart; generosity to self and others	In your game you can gift your items to other players and get 'generosity' points
Akaue'anga	<ul style="list-style-type: none">The acknowledgement and fulfilment of individual and collective duties	Score bar that measures how many group tasks and individual tasks you have done that you try to keep in balance
Tāueue	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Participation	A game that includes everyone present so numbers can be flexible
Angaanga taokotai	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Cooperation	In your game 2 or more players must work together to achieve an outcome.

Fakaápaápa	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Respect - acknowledging and returning respect 	Playing against opponents of a similar level.
Tauhi vaha'a/vā	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Maintaining mutual relationships Keeping the relationship ongoing, alive and well 	Creation of teams that play together often, or 'clans' in games
Mamahi'i me'a	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> One's loyalty, devotion and passion. 	Rewards for coming back and playing multiple times
Anga faka'eí'eiki	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Behaving with dignity which is to be principled and dignified in behaviour, speech and thought. 	Rules around game conduct and being kicked if you don't abide by them.

Faaaloalo	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Acknowledging and returning respect	Having all team songs at the beginning of the game
Alofa	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Love expressed in many forms. It is universal in scope. It springs from the heart of a Samoan, from love for other humans.	A game designed to reward you for doing tasks that help other humans.
Tautua	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Spirit of selfless serviceproviding service to others, family, religion, society, without hope of reward	A game that encourages you to help new players
Lotomauualalo	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Humility and being open. It can be evident in being teachable	Using learning steps in the first level of the game to teach the players how to play as they go

Ingenuity	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Our fresh perspective and independent thinking creates an environment where innovation and ingenuity prosper.	Have an open world game where tasks can be completed in a variety of ways.
